Dear MLP Community, When you read through this newsletter you'll see the outstanding work that has been done by our academies and the incredible results that students across the trust are achieving. Barnhill students' progress results place the school 2nd in the Borough and in the top 5% of schools nationally with +0.66 progress 8 score and substantially improved A level results. Belmore pupils have achieved some of the top results in the Borough of Hillingdon and will be within the top 5% of the schools in the country, as well as being selected for the Mayor of London's 'Schools for Success' Award.

William Byrd, a school which joined the Trust whilst in special measures only a year ago, has produced vastly improved results and has been asked to feature in a national education magazine to showcase its approach to school improvement.

One of the reasons for our success is our collaborative working ethos. Heads regularly work together to formulate plans for the development of the Trust and through our new Boards like the one for Quality First Teaching and Learning, many more of our teachers will have the opportunity to lead the future direction of the Trust.

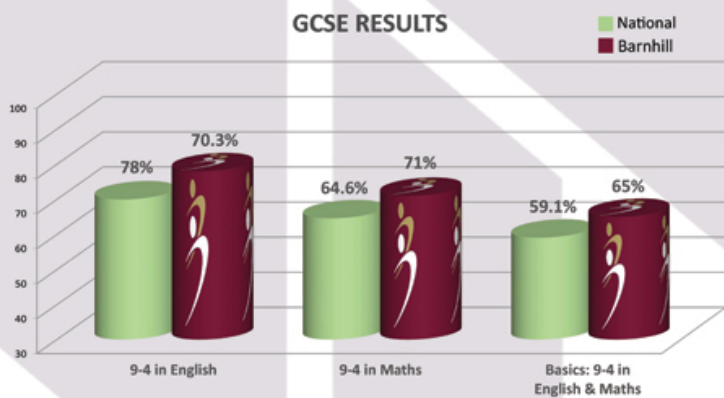

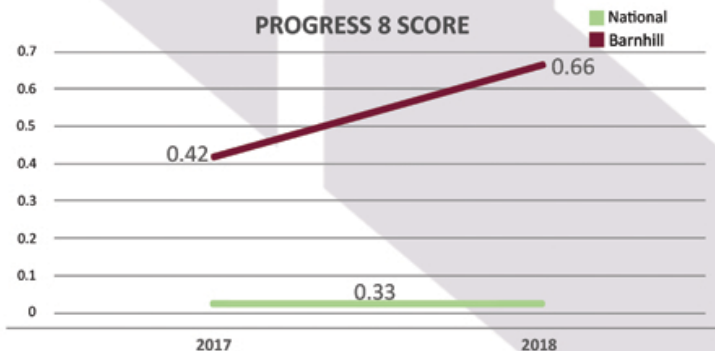

TOP 5% IN COUNTRY FOR STUDENT PROGRESS

Barnhill Community High has seen outstanding GCSE results this year. The school's Progress 8 score, which measures students' progress, has risen to +0.66, putting Barnhill Community High in the top 5% of the country.

A-level and AS-level results also marked yet another year of excellent academic and personal achievements for students at the school, with an overall pass rate of 97%.

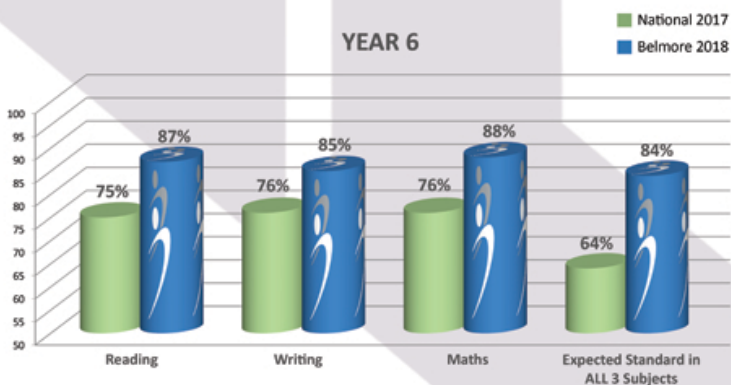

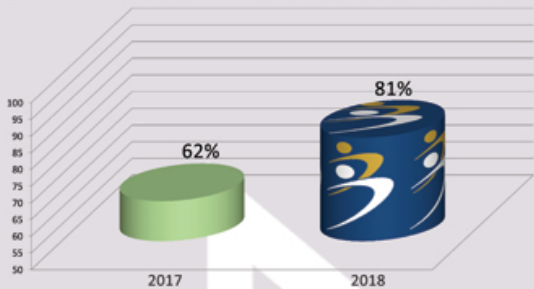
Fantastic Results

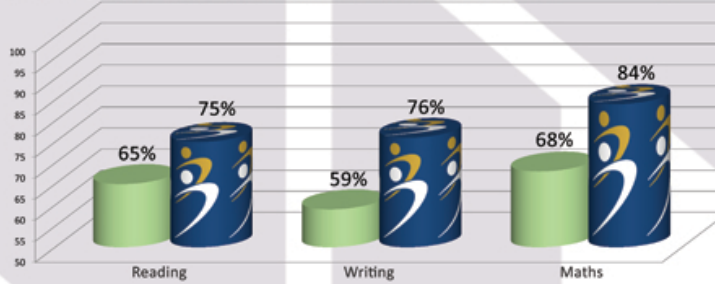
END OF EYFS

Percentage of children who achieved a Good Level of Development



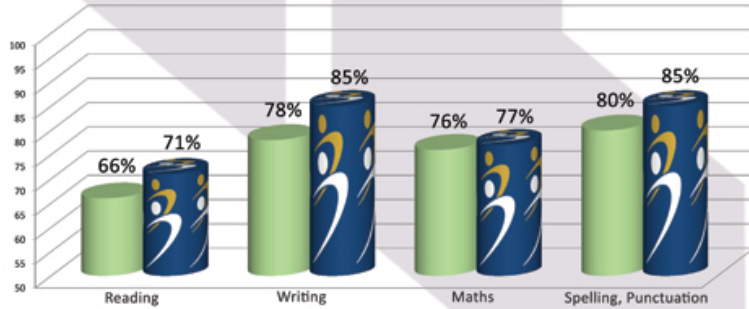
END OF KEY STAGE ONE
